

PRODUCT FOCUS: Cold & Flu

Treat only the symptoms you are experiencing. Combination products, such as Nyquil Severe, often have multiple ingredients that only treat active symptoms. There is no preventative benefit, and you may end up paying for ingredients you don't need

- <u>To reduce fever and pain:</u> Try acetaminophen (Tylenol), ibuprofen (Advil), or naproxen (Aleve). To avoid liver and kidney damage, stay under 3000 mg of acetaminophen and 1200 mg of ibuprofen per day. Avoid taking more than one product containing acetaminophen or ibuprofen, and watch the dosing of combination products!
- <u>To relieve runny nose or watery eyes:</u> Try diphenhydramine (Benadryl), which may cause drowsiness. Non-drowsy alternatives include loratadine (Claritin) and cetirizine (Zyrtec). Try fluticasone (Flonase) nasal spray to dry out just the nasal passages.
- <u>To relieve sinus pressure or a stuffy nose:</u> Try pseudoephedrine (Sudafed), which is sold behind the counter and may cause insomnia/irritability during use. Avoid if you have uncontrolled high blood pressure.
- <u>To loosen mucus:</u> Try guaifenesin (Robitussin, Mucinex) and drink plenty of water.
- To reduce cough: Try dextromethorphan (Delsym).
- <u>To relieve a sore throat:</u> Try throat lozenges, honey products, and gargling salt water.

FLU SHOT SEASON

Why?

Flu vaccines reduce the burden of illnesses, hospitalizations, and deaths related to influenza. In recent years, the vaccine has reduced the need to visit a doctor by 40 to 60%. By preventing the disease, you will save yourself time spent in recovery and the stress of dealing with an unexpected conflict. Most insurances fully cover the vaccine with \$0 copay while OTC (over-the-counter) or prescription treatments likely cost more.

How?

Two weeks after vaccination, your body will develop antibodies, which will remember, recognize, and eliminate the influenza viruses introduced in the vaccine. This phenomenon is called active immunity, and it is constantly learning new pathogens every day to strengthen your immune response. Those who cannot receive the flu vaccine (such as infants under 6 months of age) are at risk of severe complications from the flu, including pneumonia, seizures, and even death. When most of a community is immune, the virus is less likely to spread and make its way to the unvaccinated population. By receiving the vaccine, you are contributing to this process called herd immunity and protecting our future generations.

When?

Our professionals recommend receiving your annual flu vaccine by the end of October because its effects last for about 6 months. For your convenience, we will be offering flu vaccines at all three of our pharmacy locations! We carry the quadrivalent (4-strain) vaccine for patients ages 5 to 64 and the high-dose quadrivalent vaccine for those 65 and older. No appointment necessary—just walk in!

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
